KEY TO COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

- BEG** Beginner. These courses are open to all students, but are designed specifically for new writers.
- INT** Intermediate. These courses are for students with writing experience and some familiarity with workshops.
- ALL** All. These courses are for writers of all experience levels--including beginners!
- PRO** PRO/Advanced. Space may be limited in these courses for students not enrolled in PRO. A manuscript review may also be required for new students.
- GEN** Generative. These courses focus on creating new work through exercises and prompts.
- SEM** Seminar. These courses examine literary schools, craft, and/or writing theory in practice; reading is often required.
- WRK** Workshop. These courses focus on peer critique and/or revision strategies.
- MS** Multiple Styles. Classes will incorporate multiple instruction styles.
- DWC** Course will take place in-person at the Downtown Writers Center
- ONLINE** Course will take place online (e.g. Zoom)
- HYBRID** Students can join either in-person at the Downtown Writers Center or online.
- ASYNCH** Students write and share work without a weekly scheduled class.

SUMMER 2026 CREATIVE WRITING COURSES

POETRY COURSES

SUMMERING: A POETRY WORKSHOP

(ALL - GEN - ONLINE) with Yvonne Murphy. Mondays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 6. Write the poems and lyrical short prose that you've always wanted--and many others, too! Celebrate the season with a study of exciting poets and poems from all over the world. We'll have juicy, delicious, summery prompts, activities, and discussions to help us write!

STARTING FROM ZERO: RADICAL POETS IN TRANSLATION

(ALL - GEN - ONLINE) with Tim McCoy. Mondays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 6. Six weeks of generative writing guided by visionary poets from Peru, Brazil, Japan, Cuba, Egypt, and beyond. Read work that breaks every rule you know and then write poems only you could make.

POETRY IN TRANSLATION FOR ALL LEVELS

(INT - MS - DWC) with Jessica Cuello. Tuesdays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 7. Explore translation in the language of your choice--fluency not required! We'll read selected essays from *Into English*, participate in creative activities, and share their own translation for feedback.

ADVANCED POETRY WORKSHOP

(PRO - WRK - ONLINE) with Suzanne Frischkorn. Tuesdays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 7. Refine your writing and learn from others in this workshop that studies how great poems work, designed for writers with workshop experience and whose goal is publication. POETRY AND ENLIGHTENMENT

(INT - MS - HYBRID) with Tim Carter. Wednesdays, 6 to 8 PM. 4 weeks, starts July 8. Let's test the idea that haiku offers a rich model for writing poetry of change and transformation that is often missing in contemporary lyric poetry. We will talk about haiku's relationship with Zen and try writing some of our own poems.

POEMS OF DISCOVERY

(INT - GEN - ONLINE) with Patrick Meeds. Thursdays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 9. Using leaps and associations, we'll generate poems that reveal their meanings and after they're complete.

CHAPBOOK, BABY!

(ALL - MS - ASYNCH) with Sherre Vernon. Sundays, 11 AM to 1 PM, 6 weeks, starts July 12. Learn what makes a successful chapbook and help get yours off the ground! Poets will receive feedback on a 15 to 30 page manuscript and submit their chapbooks to at least one publisher. Note: half of the classes will be on zoom.

NONFICTION COURSES

WRITE YOUR BUCKET LIST

(BEG - MS - ONLINE) with Cheyenne Dorsagno. Mondays, 3 to 5 PM, 6 weeks, starts July 6. This class will workshop each person's bucket list, explore what makes a bucket list rewarding, and write different forms of artistic expression.

NONFICTION, CONTINUED

THE SUMMER FLOW: NONFICTION WORKSHOP

(ALL - WRK - ONLINE) with Georgia Pop-off. Wednesdays, 6 to 8 PM, and Thursdays, 1 to 3 PM, 6 weeks, starts July 15 and 16. Expect to share and receive comments and constructive critique. New members are welcome, so join us if you need a supportive group!

FICTION COURSES

WHO CALLS ME VILLAIN?

(INT - MS - ONLINE) with Alyssa Pfingst. Wednesdays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 8. Learn how to create exceptional, believable villains who will provide true obstacles to your protagonists while remaining grounded and real to readers.

OPEN FICTION WORKSHOP

(ALL - WRK - ONLINE) with Kelsey Day. Wednesdays, 5 to 7 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 8. In this friendly workshop, open to writers of all levels, you will share work and talk openly about what is and isn't working in each other's writing.

DRAMATIC WRITING

A SHORT COURSE FOR SHORT PLAYS

(INT - GEN - HYBRID) with Gemma Cooper-Novack. Thursdays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 9. One, five, and ten-minute plays are some of the most exciting (and most easily produced) works in the theater today! In this crash course, we'll study the short work of prominent and contemporary playwrights and create our own short plays.

CROSS-GENRE COURSES

HYBRID CRYPTIDS

(ALL - MS - DWC) with Misha Tentser. Tuesdays, 6 to 8 PM, 4 weeks, starts July 7. Investigate the strange, provocative, and hybrid forms of life through poems, short stories, and essays that exist outside or in-between genre conventions.

STRATEGIES IN REVISION

(INT - WRK - ONLINE) with Kayla Blatchley. Wednesdays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 8. Learn to revise your work with different approaches, including strategies for structural and line-level editing, responding to feedback, and refining and expanding your work. This class focuses on fiction and nonfiction.

MINIMAL WORDS, MAXIMUM IMPACT

(ALL - GEN - ONLINE) with Ona Gritz and Dan Simpson. Thursdays, 5 to 7 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 9. In this age of short attention spans, how do we hold our readers' interest? One answer is to write brief impactful pieces. Learn to craft short poems and flash prose in this hands-on supportive class.

WRITINGLY OBSESSIONS

(ALL - GEN - HYBRID) with Gemma Cooper-Novack. Saturdays, 3 to 5 PM. 6 weeks, starts July 11. Kafka had entrapment. Roxane Gay has the dialogue of love and violence. How can we mine our own obsessions into distinctive, original works without getting repetitive? We'll identify our obsessions and acknowledge the unique perspectives that make us who we are as writers.
